Activity 1

Have students get out a blank sheet of paper and write their names on it. Tell them that you are going to give them 5 minutes to write as many nouns, verbs, adjectives, etc... as they can. They love this! Then have them add them up and find out who wrote the most. Check over the sheet, if all look good reward with a treat from my candy jars.

Activity 2

My students love to do anything that involves speed. Have them get their dictionaries out and find words. Call out any word and they look it up. When they find it they give you the definitions from their book. Once they have answered they cannot go again until the next round.

Activity 3

On the top shelf where my Math materials are located, I have division and multiplication cards. You can play Around the World with either. Just hold your finger over the answers at the top.

Activity 4

Students can use the playing cards located on the stand by the computers to play Math games. For quiet games give them all a deck, have them lay out cards and make up problems. They can put sets of four or five and add them. They can lay out two at a time and multiply them together. Anything will work and they love it. Have them write their problems on notebook paper as they work them.

We also play a game called Facts on Brain. The students really enjoy playing but they have to talk and it can get a little loud. It is a good loud though. They know how to play already. All they have to do is get in groups of three and take off.
